Medical Forms

Health Insurance

- Massachusetts law requires that all students enrolled three-quarter-time or more at the start of the semester, as defined by Merrimack College, have comprehensive health insurance coverage. Domestic students must either enroll in the Merrimack College Student Health Insurance Plan or request a waiver with proof of comprehensive health insurance coverage through an outside provider. Students who do not complete the online waiver-request form by the deadline will automatically be enrolled in the Merrimack College Student Health Insurance Plan and will be responsible for the charged premium, even if they are covered by another plan.

• Matriculated graduate students may request to transfer a maximum of 25% of the total credits for their degree program from another institution. All transfer credits must be reviewed and approved in writing by the corresponding graduate program director in order for the credits to be used to complete the program. 

FINANCIAL AID



All graduate students are automatically considered for scholarship, depending on the strength of their application and the graduate program for which they are applying. These awards typically cover around 10-15% of the cost of tuition.

FELLOWSHIPS


FEDERAL FINANCIAL AID

Domestic graduate students may apply for federal financial aid by submitting a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at <u>studentaid.gov</u>. Note international students are not eligible for federal aid. There are two types of federal student aid:


- Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loans: Graduate students are eligible to borrow a maximum of \$20,500 per academic year, or up to their yearly financial aid cost of attendance, minus any other aid received.
- Federal Graduate PLUS Loans: Graduate students are eligible to apply for this credit-based loan up to a maximum of their yearly financial aid cost of attendance, minus the Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan awarded, and any other aid received.

ALTERNATIVE OR PRIVATE EDUCATION LOANS

Private loans can help bridge the gap between the cost of education and other available aid. As all private loans are subject to credit approval and the interest and fees set with the respective lender, we recommend the use of private educational loan programs only after all other types of financing are considered. We encourage you to fully research the loans and lenders that best fit your needs using ELMSelect (elmselect.com), a neutral lender and product comparison tool.



FINANCIAL AID FAQ



What funding is available to graduate students?

Merrimack College offers fellowships, assistantships, scholarships (determined by the Graduate Admissions Office or via your academic program Directors). Beyond that, eligible graduate students are able to utilize federal Direct Unsubsidized Loans of up to \$20,500 per year. These can be obtained by completing a FAFSA on www.fafsa.ed.gov. What are the eligibility requirements for federal student aid?

- You must be a domestic student. International students are not eligible for federal aid.
- You must be accepted as a degree-seeking candidate.
- You must enroll at least half-time (four credits per semester for graduate students).
- Prior to loan disbursement, you must have a valid social security number on file with the Office of Financial Aid and also complete the Entrance Counseling and Master Promissory Note online at studentaid.gov.
- Once you are enrolled, federal regulations require that Merrimack College measure your progress towards the completion of your degree program, which is called Satisfactory Academic Progress. More details may be found at merrimack.edu/graduate-aid.

How and when should I apply for federal student aid?

Domestic graduate students who wish to borrow under the Federal Direct Unsubsidized and/or Federal Graduate PLUS Loan programs should submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at studentaid.gov. To ensure efficient processing, you should complete your FAFSA prior to the start of the fall semester. Please be sure to add Merrimack's school code, 002120, to ensure your FAFSA is received.

What is the interest rate of my loan? Are there any other fees that are deducted?

What happens to my undergraduate loans if I enroll in a graduate program?

If you enroll at least half-time at Merrimack (4 credits) many loans will automatically go into deferment. You may also request deferment manually via the Registrar's Office.

IGrad is Merrimack's online resource available through MyMack to help students with managing their budgets and setting financial goals!

FINANCIAL AID FAQ

I need to take out loans for living costs. What do I do?

Student can use federal loans for as little as \$1000 to cover living costs. First, make sure all items are submitted on MyMack > Student Info > Financial Aid Portal. Each semester, funds typically disburse to student billing accounts after add/drop is over (if all documentation is on file). The funds can then be requested from the Bursar's Office to be direct deposited, mailed, or picked up. This process can take 1-2 weeks after funds disburse.

What if I need additional funds for tuition, living expenses, and rent?

If the federal limit of \$20,500 is not enough, you can borrow through the Graduate PLUS loan program by applying at <u>studentloans.gov</u>, or through one of the alternative lenders listed on our website who have a graduate loan program: www.elmselect.com. We always recommend exhausting federal loan programs first due to the flexible repayment options. Please note, educational loans are only for direct educational expenses.
